"Heart clots may result from the condition of the heart itself. (a) Without a doubt one of the most fruitful causes, alone or associated is a stasis of the blood in its cavities. That this stasis is alone capable of effecting coagulation is susceptible of proof, approaching demonstration, from the behavior of the blood under like circumstances elsewhere.

In sacculated aneurisms the fibrinous deposition is frequent in positions of greatest stagnation, at time effecting a cure by successive layers of deposition that take place."
