

Stuart Bondurant, M.D.
Dean 1974-1979

Dr. Stuart Bondurant succeeded Dr. Harold Wiggers as Dean of Albany Medical College in 1974. Dr. Bondurant received his BA degree from Davidson College and MBA from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He also received a B.S. in medicine at Chapel Hill and an MD from Duke University. He served as Dean of Albany Medical College until 1979, at which point his career took him back to North Carolina to serve as a Dean of the School of Medicine at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill from 1979 to 1994 and from 1996 to 1997. He also served as Professor of the School of Medicine at Chapel Hill from 1979 to 2004. From 1995 to 1996 he was the Director of Epidemiologic Studies at the New York Academy of Medicine. He also served as President of the American College of Physicians and the Association of American Physicians, as well as Vice President of the American Heart Association and the American Society for Clinical Investigation. During his tenure as Dean at Chapel Hill, he also served as Chairman of the Board of Directors of the North Carolina Biotechnology Center from 1988 to 1992. Additionally, Dr. Bondurant spent some time at Georgetown University serving as Senior Assistant to the President of Georgetown and was Interim Executive Vice President and Executive Dean for Health Sciences there from 2004 to 2007.
